- Luke 9:23 Then he (Jesus) said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."
- Are you a totally devoted follower or just a fan?
- Revelation 3:15-17 I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth. You say, 'I am rich; I have acquired wealth and do not need a thing.' But you do not realize that you are wretched, pitiful, poor, blind and naked.
- What is a lukewarm Christian?
- They crave acceptance and approval from people more than from God.
- They rarely share their faith with others.
- They rationalize or explain away their sin.
- They think more about life on earth than eternity in heaven.
- They only turn to God when they need something.
- They only give when it's convenient.
- They aren't much different than anyone else.
- **Revelation 3:19** Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent.
- God meets us right where we are. And then he loves us enough not to leave us there.
- Rev. 3:20 Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.

 - Not much difference in the way you live vs. the people around you.
