- Jesus said to his disciples: "Things that cause people to stumble are bound to come..." | Luke 17:1
- Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. | Ecclesiastes 4:9-10
- Also if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken. | Ecclesiastes 4:11-12
- Two is better than one. Three is even stronger.
- Who in your life feels free to ask, "Are you okay?" and won't take "I'm fine" for an answer?
- When it comes to community, if you wait to build it, you won't have it when you need it.
- Jesus had crowds, but he spent more time with his twelve disciples. Of those twelve, he had three (Peter, James, and John) who were his inner circle.
- In Jesus' highest and lowest moments, Peter, James, and John were there.
- Every single one of us needs two or three people like that.
- If you don't have a circle like that, a group at church is a great place to start.
- The most significant step we can take toward God is a step toward God's people.
- God has given us the gift of each other for the messiness that happens in the middle.
