MAKE ME Make Me Faithful

- We as a society often value riches, looks, and talent. We want flash and style.
- In the Apostle Paul's list of the fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 5, faithfulness is one of the qualities listed.
- Faithfulness is a misunderstood and undervalued word.
- To be faithful is to be steady, stable, responsible, reliable, trustworthy, consistent.
- A person who follows Jesus and is led by the Spirit is faithful, not by accident, but because *God himself* is faithful.
- ...if we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself. | 2 Timothy 2:13
- You can have all of the flash and charisma and talent, but if you're not consistent and reliable, it doesn't matter.
- We need someone to be stable for us in our instability, until we learn how to be stable ourselves.
- Slow and steady wins the race.
- Faithful over flashy. Steady over sometimes.
- "And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." | Matthew 16:18
- We have been called to be faithful, steady, and consistent.
- The greatest gift you can give to your loved ones is to be faithful, steady, and consistent.
- The greatest gift we can give to our community is to be a church that is faithful, steady, and consistent.
